CMST: Warming Up For Another Busy Term

A MESSAGE FROM CMST'S CHAIR OF TRUSTEES

I sit in the coolest room in the house to write these words and very much hope that you enjoyed the Cornish heatwave better than me! Enjoy the rest of the summer break.

First, can I thank all staff for their commitment to CMST and their accommodating patience in response to the complications caused by COVID. I know that Gareth, our admin/finance staff and all six Area Teams are doing their level best to stay in touch with each other and with you, our clients.

The Trustees are most appreciative of the staff efforts. The Trust is doing its very best to preserve staff salaries and benefits for as long as our cash position allows, after gaining significant grants and loans over recent months. We hope that our reserves will tide us over to more normal times but it remains vital for all our staff to regenerate old business and generate new business in the autumn term. I am confident that the staff will and the Trust soon hopes to appoint someone dedicated to marketing our services to help you in their work. The Trust will be reviewing our overall position at their Board meeting on 27th September which is the month that the Government's Furlough Scheme runs out.

It has been good to see the work going on to develop and expand Music EL and my thanks to all those involved with the project. The Trust is making a significant investment in EL because we believe it will become an important part of our service long after COVID has died down and become an important source of high quality educational materials. MusicEL has the potential to considerably extend our reach as a Trust and various outside bodies have been complimentary about our work so far.

I am pleased to report that CMST has now incorporated and merged with Cornwall Music Therapy Trust. Both sets of Trustees are fully behind this move and the legal niceties are complete. The CMST Board has welcomed Jackie Brant and Robin Bates as new Trustees - they will bring knowledge and expertise on Music Therapy as well as contribute importantly to our whole business.

On 12th July we held the inaugural meeting of our MT Steering Group which has broad representation of MT providers in Cornwall and will be the main vehicle for MT policy making, fundraising and financial allocations. Our MT Lead, Liz Eddy, will advise and report to the Group and Professor Tony Bunt will be a Consultant.

Scarlet adopted a regular practice routine and with support from Mum, who I have been able to have more contact with, she has gained so much confidence! Scarlet is secure in her note reading and she produces these with a lovely tone. Her reading of rhythms has improved and she can work these out independently. Mostly, she is no longer afraid to try and it is an absolute pleasure to see her progress and find such a love of music.

Triggshire Strings meet Brodsky Quartet

A huge thank you to the Brodsky Quartet and Carn to Cove for inviting Triggshire Strings to take part in the Dante Festival. Without a rehearsal venue in the Camelford area Trigg had been rehearsing only on zoom which, as a bonus, enabled players from Restormel (St. Austell) and Caradon Strings (Liskeard) to join in. After only 3 face to face rehearsals in the last week they performed a piece by Tristan Schulze, especially written for young string players and string quartet. A real challenge, especially for the new members who never had any experience playing with an ensemble before.



Working on the idea of variations the group also came up with fantastic sound effects to go with the theme of the famous Trout Quintet by Schubert.

The young players were in for a real treat when they could listen to the rest of the program, Schubert's string quintet. The quartet was joined by Laura van der Heijden on second cello, winner of BBC Young Musician of the Year a few years ago. Sublime playing, it was such an inspiration : listening to each other, creating a wide range of sounds, communicating with each other just through music, playing in tune and telling the story of the music; all the skills musicians aspire to. When the professionals were asked which advice they could give to the young musicians, the answer was: practice and play together as much as you can.

It was a well deserved reward for the huge compromise of zoom sessions where everyone is muted and can only hear the tutor but not each other.

Anyone who is interested in joining an ensemble, please contact CMST. It is not just for young people but for all ages and nobody expects you to be perfect. It gives a huge boost and a sense of purpose. Music is there to be shared, to be created together. Practising is just the preparation for exploring and enjoying ensemble playing.

Ask your child's teacher which ensemble is suitable. It's absolutely normal to be nervous before but just come for a taster session and give it a go. If you have been thinking about it for a long time or wanted to dig out your instrument this could be the start of an exiting journey.

Music Therapy News

Liz Eddy, Professional Lead for Music Therapy

Summer term 2021 has been interesting, at times challenging for the music therapists but overall we are now back to delivering in person music therapy in many of our settings. And we are very happy to be doing so! Since March 2020, many of the team have gained valuable experience in developing their practice to include delivering online sessions and that is something we now offer alongside our in person work. Throughout we continue to be hugely grateful to be supported by CMST as an organisation, as we face the ongoing uncertainties of the pandemic.

Following the CMST restructure and division into geographical areas, the music therapists are feeling more integrated into CMST, getting to know other staff members better. Having meetings online has had the benefit of making it easier for the teams to connect with each other. Liz, Carine and Sally presented at the BAMT conference in April 2021 (originally due to be held in Belfast but moved online) and shared some of the ways in which being part of a music service is bringing us opportunities for collaborative work and enabling us to work together.



We have been able to accommodate two student placements in summer 2021, both year 1 trainees. One student is training at UWE, Bristol and the other at USW, Newport. The students are having a different training experience as much of their course has so far been online. It is important that trainees are supported by offering placement opportunities, although it takes us time to do this and is not something that generates income for our service. We are contributing to developing the future workforce and there is a chance these Cornwall based trainees will work with CMST once qualified.

We are also really excited that the Music Therapy Steering group has been set up within CMST and are hoping that will consolidate opportunities for fundraising and raising awareness of the work we are doing across Cornwall.
